

This letter is to confirm my recent telegram in which you regretfully informed that your husband, Private Albert Velasquez, 35. Infantry, has been reported missing in action in France since 28 November 1.

I know that added distress is caused by failure to receive information or details. Therefore, I wish to assure you that at any additional information is received it will be transmitted to you with delay, and, if in the meantime no additional information is received, will again communicate with you at the expiration of three months.

The term "missing in action" is used only to indicate that whereabouts or status of an individual is not immediately known. It not intended to convey the impression that the case is closed. I wi emphasize that every effort is exerted continuously to clear up the of our personnel. Under war conditions this is a difficult task as must readily realize. Experience has shown that many persons reper missing in action are subsequently reported as prisoners of war, but this information is furnished by countries with which we are at war, war Department is helpless to expedite such reports.

The personal effects of an individual missing overseas are by his unit for a period of time and are then sent to the Effects Que master, Kansas City, Missouri, for disposition as designated by the
